

WHAT BELONGS IN A RED BAG?

Materials that are soggy or dripping with blood or Other Potentially Infectious Materials (OPIM)

- Blood or it's components
- Amniotic Fluid
- Peritoneal Fluid
- Pleural Fluid
- Pericardial Fluid
- Cerebrospinal Fluid
- Semen
- Vaginal Secretions
- Any free flowing blood

BIOHAZARDOUS WASTE

(Regulated Medical Waste)

WHAT DOES NOT BELONG IN A RED BAG?

- Any waste paper, including wound dressings that are not heavily soiled with blood or OPIM
- Band aids
- Paper Towels
- Used IV Bags
- Used IV or suction tubing <u>unless tubing</u> <u>contains visible blood</u>
- Soiled diapers
- Urine cups unless it contains visible blood

It if does not drip or flow it does not go into a red bag

Other Biohazardous Waste

- Sharps ONLY IN A SHARPS CONTAINER
- Lab cultures and pathology specimens
- Suction canisters (MUST BE SOLIDIFIED) containing blood or OPIM
- Empty or used vaccine vials (ONLY IN A SHARPS CONTAINER)
