## Earth Day 2014: Lessons Learned

- Large education fairs at select large sites
  - ☑ High visibility
  - ☑ Teammates loved it!
  - ☑ Direct interactions with teammates
  - Significant setup, staffing, logistics
  - Unpredictable turnout
  - Local teams require significant support
  - One day only, at few locations
  - Requires 12 hour event planning to attempt to reach all shifts
- Key Components
  - Cooking demos
  - Vendor/NGO displays and freebies
  - Decorations
  - Thousands of free garden plants
  - Newsletter sign ups, raffles
